I'M DREAMING OF A . . .

Bing croons softly on the stereo (remember those?). The gas fireplace hums quietly as the fan circulates the warmed air. The snow blows gently in a horizontal direction – roughly from Soap Lake to the Royal Slope (that would be north of here:)), closing again the just opened driveway. The children are all nestled in their beds, the soft glow of their iPods cast an eerie glow about their darkened rooms as they drift off to sleep. Even the dog and cats are curled up, together, as if to give a visual image to that oft heard saying, "Peace on Earth". Such are the pictures of Currier and Ives that have and will continue to fill our vision of Christmas. Warm, soft, comfortable, not a threat in sight. Until . . .

"In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified."

One of the reasons that I so appreciate the birth story of Jesus, other than the fulfillment of promise, is the raw emotion that is often expressed by those who are encountered by God and God's messengers. Terrified, that is how the shepherds are described. Mary is perplexed. Herod and the entire city with him were frightened. Zechariah was terrified. Why this reaction? Is God that scary? Do we have a built-in sense that if God comes to me God is coming to get me? And I don't mean in a good way! Do we fear God, or do we fear what God is about?

I suspect that it is the later – what God is about! If one thing can be said about God and the running narrative of Scripture, God surely colors outside of the lines! Water comes from rocks; donkeys talk; virgins have babies; water becomes wine; dead men rise; blind see; lame walk; salvation comes! And yet our reaction is one of fear and trembling. But the word of God to us is "do not fear".

Such a word of comfort is always needed, especially in a time like ours. We worry as the economy continues its adjustment around the world. We struggle with stories of greed that have rippling effects that remove hope and support from those who have little of each. Wars continue with untold cost in both human life and suffering. Closer to home, though it is beautiful outside we know that soon snow will come and if you can't shovel the stuff, how do you get out?

How is "incarnation" a good thing in such overwhelming situations? Is this act the beginning of God's assertion, "do not fear"? Is this word that God is present with us, even in or maybe especially in, our suffering, the beginning of our not fearing? Or is the word that as the called people of God we are called to walk with those who suffer? Are these the fulfillment of "God with us"? Is this the hope and picture of Christmas that is peace on earth – God is with us and that what God is about is the salvation, redemption

of the whole creation?! And that God chooses to be present through you and I?

Such would indeed be good news for all the world. Merry Christmas

Reports are still available for you to pick up at the church, in case you missed the meeting. Team members have done an excellent job this year, and they have summarized their work in this report. Financial reports are also included. We hope you find it all informative. Please ask questions if something comes up as you read. Thank you to the BOA members for furnishing pastries and fruit for the coffee hour following the meeting.

More progress was made in the hiring of an accountant to keep our ledgers in order. The accounting change over is to happen the beginning of December. The accountant will meet with the BOA around the middle of December to review and explain expectations. We do desperately need someone to fill the treasurer's position on the 2020 Board. This person would be able to connect the Board and the accountant for accurate reporting. Please do consider filling this position.

BOA to continue this task. At this writing, no approval is being given to spending from the general fund other than routine bill paying.

Thank you board members, ministry team leaders, and all volunteers for serving in 2019. These are all volunteer positions. Your service and time are appreciated. Your dedication supports our Zion mission.

Please continue to talk and share with the 2020 Board. You have two Communicators, Gary Burchill and Robert Anderson available to you in 2020. Everyone on the BOA will listen and find answers whenever possible. That was done in 2019. You always have a standing invitation to attend any BOA meeting at Zion. It is your Board.



There will be no quilting meeting in December. See you in January!






The days are darker and the lights feel brighter, as we enter the Advent season with contemplation and hope. Women of Zion, we would like to invite you to our special Advent Faith/Love Circle gathering on Thursday, December 12 at 12 noon in the fellowship hall. We are planning to have another "Julebord" or Christmas buffet, with members bringing various Christmassy foods. Our hostesses are Helen Skindlov and Betty Quinn. Singing and praying, sharing conversation and lunch, we will bring a special quiet-filled time to our busy Advent season.

Our study in the December Gather magazine will center on the theme, "Watch, wait, create," which was written by artist, Vonda Drees, As we dabble in art as meditation, art as intercession, art as devotion, and art as inspiration, we hope you will find deeper meaning in the Isaiah texts. With this study, you may discover a new spiritual practice you can use in your own life.

Author Vonda Drees writes in reference to Isaiah 11:1-10, "Why is this passage among our appointed readings during Advent? One of the many reasons it's included might be to assure us that, although life will have its hard times, growth can come from unlikely places. Rebirth and renewal sprout from decaying stumps. Even in the hardest moments, God is with us. And just as God is with us, we are called to be with one another."

Come, share in Advent study and prayer, "as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ."





**Advent Meditation** 

Advent is here! What do you plan to focus on to make this season of waiting, hopeful and expectant? The four Sundays in Advent give us some foretelling thoughts about Jesus' first coming...and His coming again. Lighting the candles, we see the glow in the darkness of the sanctuary. We feel the meditative expression of hymn and prayer. How can we keep the contemplation in Advent, not overtaken by the exhaustive rush of Christmas preparations?

Over the years I have turned to several Advent devotional books. One of my favorites is called "In the Bleak Midwinter" by Herbert Brokering. In his 40 meditations and prayers, he uses the Christina Rosetti poem, line-by-line, along with his own poetry and descriptions. This poem was also set to music and first appeared as the Advent hymn, "In the Bleak Midwinter," in the English Hymnal in 1906. This song is also included in our ELW (hymnal) on page 294.

Herb Brokering had a small country church background, when later, he became a pastor, teacher, confirmation leader, and songwriter and author. His daily devotions in this book include texts from Luke and Isaiah, sharing insights into Jesus birth, life, death and resurrection. He wrote, "The words of God never quit. Listen and hear the words of long ago. 'Be not afraid; only believe.'" And from his poetry, "When you first made eternity, You said my name, you knew of me." And from the song...What can I give him, give him my heart."

Will you find some way this Advent season to enrich your spiritual life by having a daily quiet time, reading the Bible (rereading the Sunday texts,) praying intently, listening to special music, or writing in a journal? Maybe you can find an Advent devotion book that will give your heart peace. Whatever you do, make this Advent a hopeful one.

Turn your eyes this Christmas To the Child who was born He came into the world Only to find sorrow and scorn


He knew we needed a Savior To set us free from sin No other way to redemption But to open your heart to Him
